1 Introduction

The TPS54428 is a single, adaptive on-time, D-CAP2[™]-mode, synchronous buck converter requiring a low, external component count. The D-CAP2™ control circuit is optimized for low-ESR output capacitors such as POSCAP, SP-CAP, or ceramic types and features fast transient response with no external compensation. The switching frequency is internally set at a nominal 650 kHz. The high-side and low-side switching MOSFETs are incorporated inside the TPS54428 package along with the gate drive circuitry. The low drain-to-source on resistance of the MOSFETs allows the TPS54428 to achieve high efficiencies and helps keep the junction temperature low at high-output currents. The TPS54428 also features auto-skip Eco-mode™ operation for improved light-load efficiency. The TPS54428 dc/dc synchronous converter is designed to provide up to a 4 A output from an input voltage source of 4.5 V to 18 V. The output voltage range is from 0.76 V to 6 V. Rated input voltage and output current range for the evaluation module are given in Table 1.

The TPS54428EVM-052 evaluation module is a single, synchronous buck converter providing 1.05 V at 4 A from 4.5-V to 18-V input. This user's guide describes the TPS54428EVM-052 performance.

2 Performance Specification Summary

A summary of the TPS54428 evaluation module performance specifications is provided in Table 2. Specifications are given for an input voltage of V_{IN} = 12 V and an output voltage of 1.05 V, unless otherwise noted. The ambient temperature is 25°C for all measurement, unless otherwise noted.

3 Modifications

This evaluation module is designed to provide access to the features of the TPS54428. Some modifications can be made to this module.

3.1 Output Voltage Setpoint

To change the output voltage of the EVM, it is necessary to change the value of resistor R1. Changing the value of R1 can change the output voltage above 0.765 V. The value of R1 for a specific output voltage can be calculated using Equation 1.

For output voltages from 0.76 V to 7 V:

$$V_{OUT} = 0.765V \cdot \left(1 + \frac{R1}{R2}\right) \tag{1}$$

Table 3 lists the R1 values for some common output voltages. For higher output voltages of 1.8 V or above, a feedforward capacitor (C4) may be required to improve phase margin. Pads for this component (C4) are provided on the printed-circuit board. Note that the resistor values given in Table 3 are standard values and not the exact value calculated using Equation 1.

3.2 Output Filter and Closed-Loop Response

The TPS54428 relies on the output filter characteristics to ensure stability of the control loop. The recommended output filter components for common output voltages are given in Table 3. It may be possible for other output filter component values to provide acceptable closed-loop characteristics. R3 and TP4 are provided for convenience in breaking the control loop and measuring the closed-loop response.

4 Test Setup and Results

This section describes how to properly connect, set up, and use the TPS54428EVM-052. It also includes test results typical for the evaluation module like efficiency, output load regulation, output line regulation, load transient response, output voltage ripple, input voltage ripple, start-up, shut-down, and switching frequency.

4.1 Input/Output Connections

Table 4 shows the input/output connectors and test points of TPS54428EVM-052. Connect a power supply capable of supplying 2 A to J1 through a pair of 20 AWG wires. Connect the load to J2 through a pair of 20 AWG wires. The maximum load current capability is 4 A. Minimize wire lengths to reduce losses in the wires. Test point TP1 provides a place to monitor the input voltages (V_{IN}) with TP2 providing a convenient ground reference. Use TP8 to monitor the output voltage with TP9 as the ground reference.

4.2 Start-Up Procedure

- 1. Ensure that the jumper at JP1 (Enable control) is set from EN to OFF.
- 2. Apply appropriate V_{IN} voltage to VIN and PGND terminals at J1.
- 3. Move the jumper at JP1 (Enable control) to cover EN and ON. The EVM enables the output voltage.

4.3 Efficiency




Figure 1. TPS54428EVM-052 Efficiency

Figure 1 shows the efficiency for the TPS54428EVM-052 at an ambient temperature of 25°C.




Figure 2. TPS54428EVM-052 Light-Load Efficiency

Figure 2 shows the efficiency at light loads for the TPS54428EVM-052 at an ambient temperature of 25°C.

4.4 Load Regulation




Figure 3. TPS54428EVM-052 Load Regulation, $V_{IN} = 5 \text{ V}$ and $V_{IN} = 12 \text{ V}$

The load regulation for the TPS54428EVM-052 is shown in Figure 3. The output voltage at 2 A load was used as reference value.

4.5 Line Regulation




Figure 4. TPS54428EVM-052 Line Regulation

The line regulation for the TPS54428EVM-052 is shown in Figure 4. The output voltage at 12V input voltage was used as reference value.

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4.6 Frequency




Figure 5. TPS54428EVM-52 Frequency

The TPS54428 uses Eco-mode™ to increase the efficiency at light load. This means that the frequency is getting lower for lower load conditions. Figure 5 shows the switching frequency of the part across the load range.

4.7 Load Transient Response




Figure 6. TPS54428EVM-052 Load Transient Response, 1 A to 3 A




Figure 7. TPS54428EVM-052 Load Transient Response, 0.01 A to 2 A

The TPS54428EVM-052 response to load transient steps are shown in Figure 6 and Figure 7. Total peak-to-peak voltage variation is as shown.

4.8 Output Voltage Ripple




Figure 8. TPS54428EVM-052 Output Voltage Ripple

The TPS54428EVM-052 output voltage ripple is shown in Figure 8. The output current is the rated full load of 4 A.




Figure 9. TPS54428EVM-052 Eco-mode™ Output Voltage Ripple

The TPS54428EVM-052 output voltage ripple during the start of Eco-mode $^{\text{TM}}$ operation is shown in Figure 9 . The output current is 30 mA.




Figure 10. TPS54428EVM-052 Eco-mode™ Output Voltage Ripple at No Load

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The TPS54428EVM-052 output voltage ripple during Eco-mode $^{\text{TM}}$ operation is shown in Figure 10. The output current is 0 mA.

4.9 Input Voltage Ripple




Figure 11. TPS54428EVM-052 Input Voltage Ripple

The TPS54428EVM-052 input voltage ripple is shown in Figure 11. The output current is the rated full load of 4 A and the input voltage is set to 5 V.




Figure 12. TPS54428EVM-052 Start-Up Relative to $V_{\mbox{\tiny IN}}$

The TPS54428EVM-052 start-up and shut-down waveforms relative to V_{IN} with no load are shown in Figure 12 and Figure 13.




Figure 14. TPS54428EVM-052 Start-Up Relative to EN

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5 Board Layout

This section provides description of the TPS54428EVM-052, board layout, and layer illustrations.

5.1 Layout




Figure 16. Top Assembly

The board layout for the TPS54428EVM-052 is shown in Figure 16 through Figure 20. The top layer contains the main power traces for VIN, VO, and ground. Also on the top layer are connections for the pins of the TPS54428 and a large area filled with ground. Many of the signal traces also are located on the top side. The input decoupling capacitors are located as close to the IC as possible. The input and output connectors, test points, and all of the components are located on the top side. An analog ground (GND) area is provided on the top side. Analog ground (GND) and power ground (PGND) are connected at a single point on the top layer near C6. The bottom layer is primarily power ground but also has a trace to connect VIN to the enable jumper, a trace to connect VREG5 to TP5, and the feedback trace from VOUT to the voltage setpoint divider network.

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


Figure 17. Top Layer




Figure 18. Internal Layer 1



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


Figure 19. Internal Layer 2




Figure 20. Bottom Layer




Figure 21. TPS54428EVM-052 Schematic Diagram
